





DELHI SCHOOL OF ECONOMICS

Genesis

The Delhi School of Economics (DSE) was established in 1949 as a centre for excellence and advanced learning and research in the social sciences with Professor V.K.R.V. Rao as the Founder-Director and the Department of Economics of the University of Delhi as the nucleus.

Guided by his vision of India's future and support from India's first Prime Minister, Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru, Professor V.K.R.V. Rao envisioned establishing an institution devoted to research and teaching in economics and allied areas in the social sciences, which would also produce students who would play an important role in the economic development and social progress of the country. Such students were to be not only well trained in rigorous theory with a quantitative orientation but also have a wider perception of important social issues facing the country.

Professor V.K.R.V. Rao was deeply inspired by a well-known prayer of Swami Vivekananda to serve the poor and downtrodden which is inscribed in the Swami Vivekananda Hall in the Delhi School of Economics.

"May I be born again and again, and suffer thousands of miseries so that I may worship the only God that exists, the only God I believe in, the sum total of all souls – and above all, my God the wicked, my God the miserable, my God the poor of all races, is the special object of my worship."

This prayer is a reflection of Professor V.K.R.V. Rao's conviction that God is one, but wise men describe him in different ways.

In pursuing his mission to establish an institution on the lines of the London School of Economics, Professor Rao had to search for talent and commitment. In the late 1940s, he was successful in appointing B.N. Ganguli as Reader and P.N. Dhar as Lecturer in the Department of Economics. He also got in touch with K.N. Raj at Cambridge well before independence and other reputed academicians over the subsequent years. By 1953, the Department of Economics had three professors – V.K.R.V. Rao, B.N. Ganguli and K.N. Raj – all of whom served the University later as Vice Chancellors. By the early 1960s, Amartya Sen, Jagdish Bhagwati and Sukhamoy Chakravarty joined as Professors. Over time, eminent economists helped shape the reputed Department.

The Delhi School of Economics Society was formally registered on November 14, 1952 for the promotion and development of an all-India centre for training and research in Economics, with Honourable Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru as its President. The Society, in turn, appointed a Governing Body for the School, with Sir V.T. Krishnamachari as its Chairman.

For some years, the School operated in the barracks near the Vice Chancellor's office and later shifted to the Arts Faculty Building. On January 18, 1956, Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru inaugurated the main DSE building (which currently houses the Department of Economics) that had been built on University land. The President of India Honourable Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan was present at the inauguration of DSE. In response to the Prime Minister's remark:

"What a magnificent building you have made, Prof Rao."

Dr. Radhakrishnan remarked:

"It is not the building that counts. It is the kind of relationship between teacher and the taught that is more important."

In recognition of a generous grant of Rs. Six Lakhs from the Birla Educational Trust, which was used to build it, the DSE Society named the building as Birla Bhawan. The Ratan Tata Trust gave a grant of Rs. One Lakh to build a library which is today a premier library in social sciences in the country and is known as the Ratan Tata Library. Subsequently in 1980, the Ratan Tata Trust gave a grant of Rs. Two Lakhs to partly cover the cost of adding an annexe to the Library building.

Until 1957, the Delhi School of Economics functioned simultaneously as a Department of the University of Delhi as well as an autonomous body. At that point, a choice had to be made - to either retain its autonomous status or be fully absorbed into the University of Delhi. Ultimately, the Delhi School of Economics merged with the University of Delhi system and the DSE building that had been made with immense dedication and passion by Professor V.K.R.V. Rao, was handed over to the University in 1957. Consequently, the Ratan Tata Library also became a part of the University Library System in 1957.

Professor V.K.R.V. Rao guided the development of the School as Director from 1949 to 1957 before becoming the Vice Chancellor of the University of Delhi in 1957. Professor B.N. Ganguli was appointed Director in his place.

In 1958, a few units which had formed part of the School -- the Rural Development Section (financed by the Ministry of Health of the Government of India) and the Orientation Centre for Foreign Technicians in India (financed by the Ford Foundation and the United States Technical Cooperation Mission), were separated and transferred to the Institute of Economic Growth (which was established by the Delhi School of Economics Society in that year as a completely autonomous institution). Another unit in the School, the Agricultural Economics Research Centre (financed by the Ministry of Food and Agriculture of the Government of India), was also administratively separated and placed under the direct charge of the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi.

Widening Umbrella

While the initial impulse for its creation came from the challenges of planning and policy making in India and other newly independent developing countries, the academic activities of DSE soon came to encompass a wider canvas.

In the 1950s, courses in Commerce, Business Management, Economic Statistics, and Economic Administration were organized as part of the programme of the Department of Economics. The Department of Sociology and Geography were also added to the Delhi School of Economics in 1959. By 1960-61, M. A. Economics, M. A. Economic Statistics, M. Com, M. A. Human Geography, M. A. Sociology, PG Diploma in Economic Administration, PG Diploma in Business Management and Ph. D. Courses were taught in the School.

The Department of Sociology was established under the leadership of internationally renowned sociologist, Professor M.N. Srinivas. He was able to put together an excellent team of eminent sociologists including Professors M.S.A. Rao, Andre Beteille and A.M. Shah. Professor J.P.S. Oberoi joined the reputed team a decade later. On September 27, 1971, the present building of Department of Sociology was inaugurated by Professor V.K.R.V. Rao in the presence of Dr. Sarup Singh, then Vice-Chancellor, University of Delhi.

The Department of Human Geography was added to the DSE family of departments in the same year under the leadership of Professor George Kurian. Reputed geographers, Professors V.L.S. Prakasa Rao and R. Ramachandaran joined him later. The name of the Department was changed to Department of Geography in 1976. The foundation stone of the 'Teaching Block' was laid by Professor V.K.R.V. Rao, then Vice-Chancellor, University of Delhi on May 29, 1960 in the presence of Professor B.N. Ganguli, then Director, Delhi School of Economics, where the entrance of the Department of Geography (and the back entrance to the Economics Lecture Theatre) is now located.

The Department of Business Management and Industrial Administration was added to the Delhi School of Economics in 1961 and relevant courses were shifted to this Department. In 1972, the Department of Business Management and Industrial Administration was re-organized into Faculty of Management Studies. Commerce grew to become a separate Department in 1967 and has been a full-fledged Faculty since 1993. Both Faculties are independent and separated from the Delhi School of Economics.

Therefore, currently the Delhi School of Economics comprises the Departments of Economics, Geography, and Sociology which are part of the Faculty of Social Sciences of the University of Delhi.

Tradition of Excellence

The Departments of Economics and Sociology have the distinction of being the earliest departments in their respective disciplines to have earned the recognition of Centres of Advanced Study by the UGC. The teaching and research focus of all the three departments of the Delhi School of Economics has evolved over the years to reflect changing economic and social needs of India and their respective disciplines.

All three departments support M.A., M.Phil. and Ph.D. programmes and have maintained what was envisaged by Professor V.K.R.V. Rao as "...a marriage between theory and practice and a balanced mixture of both..." which makes these disciplines "...useful for policy purposes and the promotion of human welfare."

Faculty members of the three departments actively carry out research in diverse fields and continue to publish in top-notch journals in their fields. Their specializations span a wide spectrum of sub-disciplines. Faculty members also continue to influence the planning process and policymaking through involvement in various national committees and bodies.

Thus, the tradition of excellence continues. The Delhi School of Economics is considered to be a premier centre for excellence in post-graduate teaching and research in Economics, Geography and Sociology. This is indeed reflected in the recognition garnered by its distinguished alumni, the world over. The School has inspired generations of students to excel in their career goals in diverse streams such as academia, research, and involvement in the social, government and corporate sectors. Undoubtedly, the Delhi School of Economics has made a distinct mark both in the Indian as well as the global arena, fulfilling the conviction of the Founder-Director:

"After all there are many universities, but only one Delhi School of Economics."





Department of Economics – A Historical Perspective

The Department of Economics is one of the oldest departments of the University. It was established in 1942 with the appointment of Professor V.K.R.V. Rao as the first Professor of the University by the Vice Chancellor, Sir Maurice Gwyer. In the early years, post graduate teaching was conducted with the help of college teachers in the one-man department in the barracks near the Vice Chancellor's office. On the initiative of the Founder-Director, Professor V.K.R.V. Rao, the Delhi School of Economics was formed in 1949 as an institution for advanced studies in Economics and allied disciplines with the Department of Economics as the nucleus and Prime Minister, Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru as its President.

By 1953, teaching shifted to the Arts Faculty and the Department of Economics had three professors – V.K.R.V. Rao, B.N. Ganguli and K.N. Raj. The School moved to its new building in 1956 and the expansion of the Department continued. The 1950s also witnessed visits by eminent economists including J.R. Hicks, Lady U. Hicks, Maurice Dobb, Nicholas Kaldor and Joan Robinson. By the early 1960s, Amartya Sen, Jagdish Bhagwati and Sukhamoy Chakravarty had joined as Professors.

At present, the Department is one of the three constituent departments of the Delhi School of Economics, the other two being Geography and Sociology, and is at the forefront of teaching and research in economics. In 1965, the Department was the first economics department in the country to be recognized by the University Grants Commission as a Centre for Advanced Studies, a distinction that it holds till today. The Department offers Masters, M.Phil. and Doctoral programmes in Economics, which draw a huge number of applicants from all over the country and many from abroad. These programmes have a strong theoretical and quantitative focus emphasizing empirical applications. Their hallmark is the dynamic curriculum offered, continuously reviewed and updated in line with the latest developments in the subject.

The Department is proud of its many past faculty members who have made significant contributions to the discipline. Foremost among these are the first three Directors of the Delhi School of Economics and Heads of the Department, V.K.R.V. Rao, B.N. Ganguli and K.N. Raj - all of whom later served the University as Vice Chancellors while B.N. Ganguli also served as Pro Vice Chancellor. The building blocks laid by them were further strengthened by ensuing faculty members including Nobel Laureate, Amartya Sen, Jagdish Bhagwati, Sukhamoy Chakravarty, K.A. Naqvi, A.L. Nagar (also served as Pro Vice Chancellor), Mrinal Datta Chaudhuri, Dharma Kumar, S.B. Gupta, K.L. Krishna, Suresh D. Tendulkar, Om Prakash, Badal Mukhopadhyay, V. N. Pandit, K. Sundaram, Pulin B. Nayak, Partha Sen, B. L Pandit, Santosh C. Panda and T.C.A. Anant. Other distinguished scholars who have served on the faculty include Pranab Bardhan, Kaushik Basu, Bhaskar Dutta, Ashok Lahiri, Raj Krishna, Prasanta Pattanaik, Tapan Raychaudhuri, G. Balachandran and Sanjay Subrahmanyam. Former Prime Minister, Dr Manmohan Singh served as faculty member from 1969 to 1971 and as Honorary Professor in 1996. In keeping with the tradition of excellence, faculty members of the Department of Economics continue to publish widely in leading national and international journals. They have also written several books, working papers and are

actively involved in various research projects. It is notable that based on its research profile, the Department has for many years been ranked the highest amongst Economics departments in India by RePEc (Research Papers in Economics), which is a global electronic archive of working papers and publications in Economics and Finance (http://ideas.repec.org/top/top.india.html).

National and International Recognition: Past and Present Faculty

Honours and Distinctions

Several former faculty members, including Amartya Sen, Jagdish Bhagwati, Sukhamoy Chakravarty, Prasanta Pattanaik, A.L. Nagar, Kaushik Basu and Bhaskar Dutta have been Fellows of the Econometric Society, a much-coveted and distinguished honour in the field of Economics. More recently, Rohini Somanathan has been awarded this honour.

Om Prakash has been honoured with the royal decoration "Knight in the Order of the Netherlands Lion" awarded by Her Majesty, the Queen of Netherlands. K.L. Krishna, V. Pandit and T.C.A Anant have served as Presidents of the Indian Econometric Society. Current faculty member, Pami Dua has also served as the President of the Indian Econometric Society. Santosh Panda served as Vice President of the South Asian University. Pami Dua has been conferred the highest honour of the University of Delhi – Nishtha Dhriti Satyam Samman. Shreekant Gupta has served as the President of the Indian Society for Ecological Economics.

Apart from these honours, current members of the Department have served as visiting faculty at the finest Economics departments around the world and as consultants to various important national and international institutions.

Involvement with Policy Making

Various members of the faculty, past and present, have been actively involved in planning and policy making. Former Prime Minister, Dr. Manmohan Singh was a faculty member in the Department during 1969-71 and again in 1996. The Founder Director of the Delhi School of Economics, V.K.R.V. Rao was the Minister for Education in the 1970s and a member of the Planning Commission. Sukhamoy Chakravarty and Suresh D. Tendulkar both served as Chairman of the Prime Minister's Economic Advisory Council. K. Sundaram served as the Chairman of the National Accounts Advisory Committee and a member of the Expert Group to Review the Methodology for Measurement of Poverty. Kaushik Basu was Chief Economic Advisor in the Ministry of Finance, and later Vice President and Chief Economist of the World Bank.

T.C.A. Anant was a member of Union Public Service Commission. He earlier served as the Chief Statistician of India and Secretary, Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation, and Member Secretary, ICSSR. Pulin Nayak and Aditya Bhattacharjea have served on the Board of Directors of Export Import Bank of India and the Competition Law Committee. Santosh Panda served on the Board of Directors of the National Housing Bank. Pami Dua served as a member of the first Monetary Policy Committee of India. Several others have served as members of high-level government and international bodies.

At the international level, Delhi School of Economics has been an active participant in the United Nations based Project LINK from the early 1980s through the life of the project till 2020. Project LINK integrated independently developed national macro models into a global model for macroeconomic forecasting and policy analysis. Those associated with it in the past from DSE include V. Pandit and K. Sundaram. Pami Dua was recently the lead faculty from the Department in this project.

Department Journals

The Department houses the journal, *Indian Economic Review*, since 1952. The journal has established itself as an international outlet for publishing high quality research in Economics under the stewardship of illustrious editors and managing editors including V.K.R.V. Rao, B. N. Ganguli, K. N. Raj, K. A. Naqvi,

Manmohan Singh, Prasanta K. Pattanaik, Dharma Kumar, Suresh D. Tendulkar, V. Pandit, Partha Sen, Sunil Kanwar and Pami Dua. Since 2017, it has been published by Springer, a reputed international publisher and is currently edited by Uday Bhanu Sinha. Faculty members of the Department also edited the *Indian Economic and Social History Review* and the *Journal of Quantitative Economics* for several years

Conferences and Workshops

The Department regularly organises conferences, workshops and seminars. For about a quarter century, it runs an annual event, named the Winter School, in collaboration with the Econometric Society, and tries to educate, update and encourage the best young minds in the discipline. The School brings in distinguished economists worldwide to interact with doctoral students and faculty. Speakers at the recent Winter Schools have included Nobel laureate Thomas Sargent (New York University), Stephen Morris (Princeton University), Ariel Rubinstein (New York and Tel Aviv Universities), M. Scott Taylor (University of Calgary), Kaushik Basu (Cornell University), Gita Gopinath (Harvard University), Nobel Laureate Abhijit Banerjee (MIT), Pol Antràs (Harvard University), Pascaline Dupas (Stanford University), Vijay Krishna (Penn State University), Martin Uribe (Columbia University), Tayfun Sonmez (Boston College), Michael Woodford (Columbia), Whitney Newey (MIT) and Mark Rosenzweig (Yale). Winter School 2022 was organized during December 14-17, 2022. Invited distinguished speakers were Aldo Rustichini (Minnesota), Michael Greenstone (Chicago), Bruce Hansen (Wisconsin Madison) and Raouf Boucekkine (Rennes School of Business/Aix-Marseille School of Economics)

The Department hosted several workshops, conferences and seminars periodically in the recent past. The Department organised the Asian Meeting of the Econometric Society (AMES 2012), the most prestigious learned society in the field of economics. In 2013, the Department organised a special Golden Jubilee conference of the Indian Econometric Society (TIES). Asia-Pacific Innovation Conference (APIC 2018) that brings together scholars in the Asia Pacific region interested in the legal, managerial and economic aspects of innovation, was hosted by the Department. The Public Economics Workshop was organised jointly with the Centre for Research on the Economics of Climate, Food, Energy, and Environment (CECFEE), the Indian Statistical Institute, in 2017. For four consecutive years, annual conferences have been organised in collaboration with the Centre for Competitive Advantage in the Global Economy (CAGE), the University of Warwick. The Department is the lead institution in India participating in the BRICS Network University, an initiative undertaken by the National Governments. In 2022-23, the Department organized two workshops: (I)Trade, Unequal Gains and Development in collaboration with IDE-JETRO during September 16-17, 2022 (ii) 75 years of Productivity Growth in India: Issues, Measures, Causes and Impact during February 24-25, 2023

Apart from these events, the Department runs a regular seminar series and hosts lectures by distinguished economists, like Nobel laureates Angus Deaton, Eric Maskin, John Nash, Amartya Sen, and Thomas Sargent. Other notable speakers have included Kaushik Basu, Partha Dasgupta, Hal Varian and Pranab Bardhan. Top policymakers including Montek Ahluwalia, C. Rangarajan, Arvind Subramanian and Gita Gopinath have also spoken at various events in recent years.

Alumni

The Department is proud of its numerous alumni who have gone on to distinguished academic careers, including Fellows of the Econometric Society such as Dilip Abreu, Bhaskar Dutta, Gita Gopinath, Vijay Krishna, Tapan Mitra, Dilip Mookherjee and Arunava Sen (who was also awarded the prestigious Infosys Prize). Department alumni can be found in most major Economics, Business and Public Policy departments worldwide, very often as members of the faculty, and even more commonly, as doctoral students. They have also carved a niche for themselves in the government, corporate arena, banking, social sector, consulting, publishing and media.



Introduction

The Department of Geography was established in October 1959. Professor V.K.R.V. Rao, an eminent economist and the then Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi, founded the Department of Human Geography as a constituent of the Delhi School of Economics. Professor George Kurian, a well-known geographer of India, was the first Head of the Department. The name of the Department was changed to the Department of Geography in 1976 to widen the scope of teaching and research activity in the physical and human aspects of Geography. The Department has evolved many new courses, which have been widely acclaimed as frontiers in Geography. Today, it is well known as among the premier departments of the country, offering the most contemporary courses in the discipline. Department of Geography was among the 101-150 ranked Departments in QS World University Rankings, 2017 and the First in India. In 2020-21 it was among the 151-200 ranked Departments in QS World University Rankings, 2020-21.

Faculty Members

Faculty members have published several research papers in reputed journals and books with national/international publishers and regularly attend national and international conferences. Faculty members also undertake research projects from various agencies including the University Grants Commission, Indian Council of Social Science Research, Council for Scientific and Industrial Research, Indo-Canadian Shastri Institute and Ministries of Govt. of India, which include Indian Space Research Organization, Department of Science and Technology and Planning Commission as well as from International agencies such as Swedish Council for Higher Education, Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, Canada among others. Faculty members of the Department serve on several international and National level Committees including as Chairs of the International Geographical Union's Commissions and in the Executive of the National Association of Geographers India.

Programmes

The Department draws students from different parts of India as well as from abroad. It offers a two-year Master of Arts (M.A.) programme in Geography, for which more than 100 students are admitted. The Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) programme emphasizes original research with a focus on primary data collection and analysis of data using the advanced methodology and computer-aided skills. Through teaching and research, the Department reflects the vital role of Geography in a changing world.

Alumni

Alumni of the Department serve in prestigious organizations and administrative services of the Government of India and State Governments. Several are also in Faculty positions in Higher Education Institutions in India and abroad and serving with international bodies such as the UN.

Facilities

The Department is equipped with a state-of-art GIS laboratory, geomorphology-cum-remote sensing laboratory with facilities for photogrammetry, aerial photo interpretation, digital image processing and soil analysis. The GIS laboratory is fully equipped with 30 computers, 3 work stations, server, scanners, plotter, printers, the latest GIS, remote sensing and statistical software like Arc View/Info GIS, ILWIS, MapInfo, IDRISI Andes, ERDAS Imagine, WMS, SPSS etc. The Department has also initiated a Media Lab and added a reading room for research scholars.

UGC – Special Assistance Programme

The Department has been a part of the University Grants Commission Special Assistance Programme (SAP) for DRS-I to DRS-III. The traditional thrust areas of the Dept have been Natural Resource Management and Urban and Regional Planning. These have since been expanded to include contemporary areas such as Gender Space and Society. UGC sanctioned staff and grants to develop GIS and geomorphology-cum-remote sensing laboratories. As a result, the Department has been able to offer more advanced level courses in remote sensing, geographical information systems, physical geography and computer-aided cartography. Under the Programme the Department has acquired databases like that of the Census of India.

The Department of Sociology was established by the University of Delhi in 1959 as a constituent of the Delhi School of Economics under the leadership of eminent sociologist Professor M. N. Srinivas. It developed excellence in teaching and research under the guidance of stalwarts who established the discipline in India: Profs. M. S. A. Rao, Andre Beteille, A.M. Shah and J.P.S. Uberoi in the 1960s, and Profs. B. S. Baviskar, Anand Chakravarti, E. A. Ramaswamy and Veena Das subsequently. This intellectual legacy was taken forward by renowned scholars who helmed the department subsequently: Profs. Aneeta A. Minocha, Virginius Xaxa, Tulsi Patel, Meenakshi Thapan, Rajni Palriwala, Nandini Sundar, Satish Deshpande, Abhijit Dasqupta and Roma Chatterji, and Sudha Vasan is the Head since April 2021.

The Department has pioneered several fields of study which have now become essential to the discipline, and designed courses for its Masters students that have become the prototype for teaching sociology across India. To begin with, the Department trained students for two courses: M.A. and Ph.D. In 1966, a two-year M.Litt. course was introduced, which continued since 1976 till recently as a M. Phil. degree. In 1968, the Department was recognized as the sole Centre of Advanced Study (CAS) in Sociology by the University Grants Commission (UGC) and completed 50 years of continuous CAS status in 2018. At present, the sanctioned strength of the faculty includes seven Professors, ten Associate Professors, nine Assistant Professors, and three Research Associates, and 10 sanctioned office staff.

The Department draws students from all regions of India, South Asia and beyond for all its courses and offers them a coordinated teaching and research programme. From its very inception, the Department has encouraged a view of learning in which students are given an opportunity to participate actively in discussions. Classroom lectures and student-teacher interactions are supplemented with an active tutorial programme. Small groups of students have weekly meetings with tutors to discuss particular topics and readings, where individual needs and interests of students are assessed and supported. Each student writes an essay for each course every semester and receives continuous feedback. In addition, in the last three years, an innovative Academic Reading and Writing workshop-stylecourse has been introduced for MA students entering the department providing training in this essential skill, and several new courses in emerging areas are continuously added to the syllabus.

We have a robust research training program that has produced nearly 500 M. Phil. dissertations and more than 185 Ph.D. thesis, and many of our alumni continue research and teaching in Universities across the world. Our PhD scholars have done fieldwork in many parts of India and the world and theses submitted in our department have been published as well-received books. Our alumni have distinguished themselves in a wide variety of fields such as social service, administration, policy making, entrepreneurship, arts and culture, journalism, as well as teaching and research enriching the discipline of sociology. The department has actively associated with academic institutions across the world, with several collaborative research projects, exchange of faculty and students, and developing comparative sociology. Distinguished scholars from India and abroad regularly visit and deliver lectures and

seminars in the Department, some of them as Visiting Professors and Fellows. Following Srinivas' footsteps, the Department has cemented a distinct tradition of rich, ethnographic work that raises and responds to critical questions about the times we live in. Department faculty are actively engaged in research in diverse areas such as family and kinship, education, political movements, affirmative action, caste, religion, political ecology, urban life, agrarian structure, development and environment, etc.(details available at www.sociology.du.ac.in) that have been widely published as books and articles in recognized journals. Significant studies have been published by faculty on community power structures, local-level politics, trade unions, co-operatives, textual and contextual studies of Hinduism, religious symbolism, family and kinship, social and religious movements, and environment and society.

Research contributions of the department are recognized in the fields of stratification, gender, sociology of development, environment, historical sociology, urban sociology, the sociology of collective violence, medical sociology, sociology of masculinity, demography, popular and visual cultures, education, migration, and documentary practices of the state among others. Faculty have been associated with the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) and the UGC in preparing surveys of research and teaching in the discipline. Department faculty are active in national and international sociological associations, including serving in administrative roles of these professional associations and are members of editorial boards of reputed journals. Department faculty regularly organize and participate in national and international conferences, seminars and workshops to disseminate research and develop the discipline. The also engage with society by publishing and speaking in popular and public fora. The Department Friday Colloquium is recognized as one of the oldest continuously running forum for discussion of on-going sociological research, and it attracts distinguished and emerging scholars to present and discuss research. The Department of Sociology has created history by ranking 91 globally in the QS World Ranking released in 2023.



Ratan Tata Library

The Library of the Delhi School of Economics (DSE), better known as the Ratan Tata Library (RTL) was established in 1949. It is today a premier library in the country for Social Sciences.

In its formative years, the Delhi School of Economics Society received a benefaction of Rs. One Lakh from the Ratan Tata Trust for its Library. That is how the name Ratan Tata Library of Delhi School of Economics came to stay. Subsequently in 1980, the Ratan Tata Trust gave a grant of Rs. 2 Lakhs to meet partly the cost of adding an annexe to the Library building which was completed in 1986 at a cost of Rs. 6 Lakhs. The addition of the new block enabled the library to consolidate the holdings of periodicals.

After the library was established under the leadership of Prof, V.K.R.V. Rao, Prof. B.N. Ganguli was given the charge of expanding and maintaining the library. The Ratan Tata Library became a part of the University Library System in 1957, when the Delhi School of Economics ceased to be an autonomous institution and its management was taken over by the University of Delhi.

Considered one of the best equipped libraries in Economics and allied fields in Asia, the Ratan Tata Library has a wide-ranging collection of literature on social sciences and business material, serving a rich resource pool for the students and faculty. The library also serves its purpose of helping in a cross-disciplinary approach to the subjects.

The library has a total collection of over 2,03,666 books, 1,33,300 bound periodicals. In the past more than sixty years, it has not only become a partial depository of publications of the United Nations and several other International Organizations (30,000 such publications are available) but has also developed a phenomenal collection of 40,000 documents of the Central and State Governments, including Reports of various Committees and Commissions. The collection of Theses and Dissertations has grown to more than 1600 records. 236+ 4 Newspapers current titles of the journals and approx. 60 United Nations and Government reports are being subscribed in the library. It has 40,000 e-journals and about 60 e-resourcesaccess through Delhi University Library System website.

The library has access to OPAC (e-catalogue), WebOPAC (online catalogue accessible through internet across the globe), internet and e-resources on 64 terminals placed in the e-library. Additionally, the RTL has 4 terminals for OPAC and 2 terminals have been exclusively setup for the differently abled. The seating capacity of the library is around 270.

It also provides Resource Sharing Services through ILL (Inter-Library Loan) and DELNET (Developing Library Network).

The Ratan Tata Library also provides services through Delhi University Library System website i.e. http://crl.du.ac.in/.


